

Literacy

Reading

Daily phonics, school/home reading books, guided reading sessions, reading for pleasure books, daily story, rhyme & song times where we talk about setting, characters, rhyme, alliteration etc.

Writing

We will be writing/mark making for story maps, simple instructions, adapting poems, reading and writing 'Tricky Words' & simple sentences, Pencil control & fine motor activities such as dough disco & funky fingers. Opportunities for mark making during continuous provision indoors & outdoors

Communication and Language

Listening & Attention, Speaking, Understanding

Listening to stories, rhymes and poems, alliteration, building up vocabulary related to topic, retelling familiar stories, adapting familiar stories, poems & rhymes.

Role Play – home corner, Police Station, Fire Station, Dentist Surgery, 3 Bears Cottage, Cafe, Fruit & Veg Shop/Garden Centre

Physical

Children will develop basic gymnastics. They will create basic movements, shapes, balances and jumps and develop rocking and rolling. They will use core muscle strength to balance. They will combine different movements.

They will talk about different roles in society, similarities and differences between things in the past and now. They will explore the natural world around them, make observations and drawings.
