I'm sure you're all very aware, but I wanted to just remind you, that we will always take great care of your child if they're not feeling 100% (and administer medicines if necessary with consent), so if you're in any doubt about whether to send them in, please do give us a call and we can help you make that decision. Obviously things like sickness/diarrhoea there is the 48hours period when they need to be at home.
