Next, we practised empathy by watching videos of kindness in action and then said kind things to each other in the classroom. To put our kindness into action, we thought of someone we knew who could do with a little kindness and then made them something

in our classrooms to give to them. We feel being kind really is the best thing that anyone can be and we really appreciated the opportunity to spend the morning thinking specifically about this.
