No further investigations are required for our school.

Clothing- As we start a new term, please can we remind you that all children must have a waterproof coat in school every day, unless the forecast is certain that it will be warm and dry. It is also essential that children have waterproof clothing and wellies for forest school on Friday.

Monday- Sports club run by Active ed education, a selection of sports and fun games. Available to all year groups £4 per child.


Tuesday- Dance club run by Starlight Dance company. Available to all year groups £4 per child.

The sessions should cost £6 each per child but the school intends to use Sports Premium money to partially fund this, reducing the per session cost to £4.
